Fishery-related facilities (administration and fish handling building, workshop, etc.), landing jetty, a mooring type sea wall, slipway, etc.

Outline of the Project

This project is the first fishery complex in Barbuda.

The landing jetty and seawall will improve safety and efficiency in landing catches. Not only will the safety of the fishermen be improved, but they will be able to work more efficiently.

As the Fish Handling Building is equipped with an ice machine, the catches will be kept fresh. Sanitary conditions will therefore be better, and the value of the catch will be elevated. As a result, it will be possible for people in Barbuda to consume greater quantities of higher quality fish, and also to distribute the catches to Antigua. The people of Antigua can consume more fish from Barbuda, and Antigua and Barbuda will not have to depend on fish imports as heavily as it does now. Furthermore, it will even become possible to export fish to the EU, Caribbean and USA from Barbuda.
